## NEW FIVER RIVERS DISTRICT CREATED TO SUPPORT SCOUTING IN MOBILE COUNTY

The mission of any Boy Scout Council is to provide service to units and youth. How you go about doing that is up to the council volunteers and the operating structure of a council.

Back in the early fall, the Council President Phil Webb and Council Commissioner Bob Ware hosted a meeting at the Boy Scout Office with representatives from all five districts, either the District Chairman or District Commissioner (the top volunteers of the district) or both, to get their input & direction as we move forward providing service to our units. This "District Operations Task Force Committee" was formed to discuss district operations with our current staff size and how best to move forward as a council. What remains the same? Baldwin District: the employee to offer direct support to Baldwin County units will now be Senior District Executive Ed Stephens. Maubila District: part time staff member Peet Wert will continue to provide direct support to the nine units in Washington & Clarke Counties.

What will change? Mobile County Districts will become one district: Choctaw, Spanish Trail and Cloverleaf will come together and form a new District, known as Five Rivers District. The employee to offer direct support to units in Mobile County will be the field staff member with the most Scouting experience for this new larger district, Senior District Executive Cary

Wilson. A timeline was created for implementation. Over the next several weeks in the month of October, the members of the three District Committees and District Commissioner Staff's came together and gave direct leadership thru the annual nominating committee process. This process will be led by Merlin Miller, the District Chairman of the new district and Scott Mueller, the new District Commissioner. An announcement was made at the November Roundtable for the future meeting location and people were given a chance for input for the new district name. The new District met for the first time at December's Roundtable. From a unit leader's point of view, other than monthly roundtable meetings, everything else will feel and remain the same. Here is a sample of the new district events: We project that the new District Roundtable meetings will grow to 50+ Scouters (Better experience for the Scout Leaders). The first Five Rivers District held on December 4th had over 70 people in attendance. The New District Camporees will grow to 11-13 troops for each of the two events a year, the one event in the spring and one event in the fall (Better experience for the Scouts.) The event is scheduled to take place on March 5-7 at Boy Scout Camp Pinetreat. Other events, such as, Cub Scout Day Camp for Mobile County Scouts is already done together as one camp with 140+ Cub Scouts in June.
